Born in Paris, he is the son of Michel Valsan (Cheikh Mustafa Abd al-Aziz), the first great interpreter of Ibn Arabi in the West. As editor of the publication [Science Sacrée](#), he continues his father's work and studies the universal expression of initiatory doctrines. His teachings are part of the legacy of [René Guénon](#). The principles of the sacred texts are fundamental when Cheikh Muhammad Valsan addresses applications in the arts and sciences. He is involved in interfaith dialogue and participates in numerous international conferences.



Dr. Neil Douglas-Klotz

Saadi Shakur Chishti holds degrees in religious studies, psychology, and somatic psychology and for many years was co-chair of the Mysticism Group of the American Academy of Religion. He is an independent scholar with training in hermeneutics, ancient Semitic languages, and sacred movement. He has been following the Sufi path for over 40 years and is the khalif of Hazrat Moineddin Jablonski, who was the khalif of Sufi Ahmed Murad Chishti. He co-founded the [International Network for the Dances of Universal Peace](#) and has authored several books, including *The Sufi Book of Life*, *Desert Wisdom*, and *Revelations of the Aramaic Jesus*.



Shaykh Hamdi Ben Aïssa

An artist, researcher, and teacher, he is the founder of the [Alchemy Institute for Contemplative Studies](#), an initiative rooted in the Sufi tradition, open to all those who are searching for truth.
